"NDA wins elections through "Manipulation and Conspiracy:" Tejaswi

Patna, Apr 29 (UNI) Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) national working president and Leader of the Opposition in the Bihar Assembly Tejaswi Yadav, on Wednesday, accused National Democratic Alliance (NDA) leaders of being insensitive to public concerns.

Accusing NDA leaders of winning elections through "manipulation and conspiracy," Yadav alleged that the NDA leaders were totally insensitive towards public issues. Levelling sharp allegations against NDA leaders, he described union Minister Jitan Ram Manjhi and Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Vijay Kumar Chaudhary as "ruthless, careless, and insensitive," alleging that leaders who come to power through such means fail to address the problems of ordinary people.

Referring to the recent incident in Delhi involving the alleged police shooting of a youth from Bihar, Yadav questioned the role of the central government and the union Home Ministry led by Amit Shah. He claimed that the youth was shot dead "only for being from Bihar," an allegation aimed at the functioning of the Delhi Police. Yadav also criticised a purported remark attributed to Manjhi, "If he was killed, what can be done?" calling it a reflection of extreme insensitivity. He further targeted Vijay Kumar Chaudhary for reportedly being unaware of the incident. Appealing to the people to elect leaders carefully, Yadav said that electing "insensitive leaders" in exchange for short-term gains would result in such responses. He warned that accepting monetary inducements during elections would lead to continued neglect of public issues.

Odisha CM Majhi unveils Rs 1,300 cr worth infra, development projects to mineral-rich Keonjhar dist

Bhubaneswar, April 29 (UNI) Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi on Wednesday unveiled a series of development projects worth Rs 1,300 crore to provide facilities to the overall growth and infrastructure in mineral-rich Keonjhar, his home district.

At a major development conclave, the Chief Minister, on a one-day visit to his home district, dedicated, launched, and announced a total of 187 projects with an estimated cost of Rs 1,330.24 crore. This includes foundation laying for 62 projects worth around Rs 705 crore and inauguration of 24 completed projects built at a cost of approximately Rs 251 crore. Additionally, a new package of Rs 375 crore was announced for 101 upcoming projects. Besides in a significant push towards modern urban transport, the Chief Minister flagged off 25 state-of-the-art e-buses and inaugurated an 'Ama Bus' depot built at a cost of Rs 17 crore. The smart public transport system aims to provide affordable and safe commuting options to residents. Fares for the e-bus service will start from just Rs 5, making it highly accessible for daily commuters, especially those from lower and middle-income groups. All buses are fully air-conditioned and equipped with CCTV cameras, panic buttons, and GPS tracking systems to ensure passenger safety, particularly for women. The initiative also emphasizes women's empowerment, with around 150 employment opportunities created, including 30 women guides and 2 women drivers. The move strengthens the state government's focus on increasing women's participation in key sectors. Addressing the gathering, the Chief Minister stated that Keonjhar has contributed significantly to the state's economy while it was meted out neglect in the past. He asserted that development has accelerated under the current government and announced that a mega steel plant in the district is in the final stages of planning, with foundation work to begin soon. He reiterated the vision of transforming Keonjhar into one of India's leading industrially developed districts. Highlighting environmental benefits, the Chief Minister noted that the e-bus service is expected to reduce carbon emissions by 330-390 tonnes annually. Plans are also in place to expand the service to other cities across Odisha, with Rs 238 crore earmarked for maintenance and expansion. On the occasion, financial assistance worth Rs 5.75 lakh was distributed among six beneficiaries. It included Rs 50,000 for marriage assistance and Rs 3.05 lakh as death compensation, along with financial aid under the 'Udyami' scheme to several beneficiaries. The event was attended among others by the District Planning Committee Chairman Dr. Fakir Mohan Naik, MP Ananta Naik, Patna MLA Akhil Chandra Naik, Special Development Council Chairperson Mamita Naik, and District Collector Vishal Singh.

Ancient stone idol unearthed during pond excavation in Malda

Siliguri, Apr 29 (UNI) A routine pond excavation in West Bengal's Malda district took a dramatic turn after a centuries-old stone idol was unearthed from beneath the soil, triggering widespread curiosity and excitement among locals.

The incident occurred in Bhalukdanga village under Shahjajpur Gram Panchayat in Gazole block, where excavation work had been underway for the past few days. On Wednesday morning, an excavator engaged in digging operations struck a hard object, bringing to light what appeared to be an ancient stone sculpture buried underground.

As news of the discovery spread, villagers thronged the site. The artifact was carefully

cleaned, revealing intricate carvings that led locals to identify it as an idol of Lord Vishnu. In a spontaneous expression of devotion, residents soon began offering prayers at the spot, briefly turning the excavation site into a place of worship. Police from Gazole Police Station reached the scene promptly after being informed and took possession of the idol. It has since been shifted to the police station for safekeeping, pending further examination.

Officials are expected to notify the Archaeological authorities to assess the idol's antiquity and historical significance. The discovery has once again drawn attention to the rich archaeological potential of the Barind region. Notably, several

ancient idols and relics have been recovered over the past few decades from different parts of the Barind belt, particularly in Bahupur and Gazole blocks of Malda, as well as adjoining areas of South Dinajpur district. Of special significance is Jagajjibpur, a site that has emerged as a key centre of archaeological interest following the discovery of remains linked to the Pala dynasty. Excavations at Jagajjibpur have provided valuable insights into early medieval Bengal, reinforcing the region's historical importance. Experts believe that the latest find could be part of this larger cultural and historical continuum, underscoring the need for systematic exploration and preservation efforts in the area.

Bengali actors join the list of voters in phase-2 polling

Kolkata, Apr 29 (UNI) : As phase-2 of the West Bengal assembly elections unfolded on Wednesday, the state's film fraternity turned up in full strength to exercise their democratic right, urging the people to cast their vote.

Among the prominent names at the polling booths were actor-filmmaker couple Subhashree Ganguly and Raj Chakraborty (TMC candidate from Barrackpur assembly constituency), who arrived in relaxed casual wear at the Kasha polling booth for the occasion. Ganguly opted for a black T-shirt and jeans, while Chakraborty kept it classic in a white shirt and denim.

The couple later shared a post-voting selfie on Instagram, proudly displaying their inked fingers and encouraging citizens to take part in the electoral process.

In her interaction with the media, Ganguly invoked a striking metaphor: "We get to see Maa Durga twice, once every year and again every five years. She comes to shield the common people from wicked demons." Her husband echoed her words.

Actor Abir Chatterjee was also seen at a polling booth as he joined the long list of film personalities turning up to cast their ballot.

Wearing a blue salwar, Sohini Sarkar was among the celebrity voters seen at polling booths, where she exercised her franchise and later encouraged others to vote by proudly displaying her inked finger. Veteran actor and former TMC MLA Chiranjit Chakraborty was also seen at the Rashbehari constituency with his wife. However, he faced a technical issue with the electronic voting machine, which prevented him from casting his vote at that moment. He told onlookers that he would return later to fulfill his voting responsibility.

Veteran actor and BJP leader Mithun Chakraborty, too made his way to the Kashiapur-Belgachhia constituency, wearing a black T-shirt, cap and sunglasses, along with an orange scarf around his neck. After voting, Chakraborty spoke to the media and said he had not asked for any special arrangements. He said he was confident that the process would remain smooth and peaceful.

Adding to the long list of Tollywood names at the polling booths, veteran star Prosenjit Chatterjee arrived to cast his vote alongside his son, Trishanjit Chatterjee, who cast his vote for the very first time. The 63-year-old actor kept his look casual in an olive green shirt and sunglasses, while his son was seen in a yellow shirt and cap.

Actress Koel Mallick, who recently joined TMC as a member of Rajya Sabha, also stepped out to vote, underdressed by the scorching afternoon heat. Clad in a white embroidered salwar, she reached the polling booth accompanied by her parents, veteran

actor Ranjit Mallick in a blue shirt and mother Deepa Mallick in an embroidered saree. Actor and Trinamool Congress MP Dev also arrived at the polling booth with his family, accompanied by his parents and sister, as part of his usual election-day ritual. Actor-turned-politician Sayantika Banerjee was extremely busy on this day. Dressed in a yellow saree and sunglasses, she was seen in her Baranagar constituency where she is a candidate after casting her vote in the Bidhannagar assembly constituency.

Accompanied by his brothers, their families and wife Mohona Raitani, actor Jeet was seen at the polling booth, where a BSF jawan taking a selfie with the actor.

Akhilesh : SP adopts motion of censure against BJP

Lucknow, Apr 29 (UNI) Blaming BJP for misusing the central forces in the West Bengal assembly polls, Samajwadi Party National President Akhilesh Yadav today claimed that Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee will win the election hand down with a historic number of votes and seats.

"The people of Bengal are voting in large numbers in favour of Didi. The BJP is destroying democracy. In Bengal, an entire administrative structure has been created. A DG has been appointed equal to the DGP. In every district, officers have been appointed equal to the Captain. The BJP has given benefits to those who have been appointed. Many officers have been sent who are embroiled in investigations," he told reporters here. The BJP wants to do the same in Bengal as it did in Rampur and Sambhal in UP bybolls, he added. Meanwhile, in another development, anticipating the BJP move to criticise the opposition over the women reservation in the special session of the Uttar Pradesh assembly, the Samajwadi Party Legislative Party meeting transformed itself into a House of Assembly and unanimously passed a "Motion of censure" against the BJP. Today, at the Samajwadi Party State Headquarters in Lucknow, in the presence of Samajwadi Party National President Akhilesh Yadav, the women MLAs unanimously supported the "Motion of censure." Leader of the Opposition Shri Mata Prasad Pandey, a former Speaker of the assembly, assumed the role of Speaker and, after soliciting the MLAs' opinions on the "Motion of censure."
